VISION AUTHORITY

The TCVA is available to meet and conduct business as necessary.

Key actions include:

October 2014: approved allocation of \$45.5 million of surplus funds to the suburban communities, divided by population.

January 2016: approved allocation of all remaining funds to Tulsa County, funds estimated at \$21.5 million.

August 2023: authorized \$800,000 for funding to structurally stabilize the North Boston Avenue Bridge at the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame.

SALES TAX OVERVIEW COMMITTEE

The Sales Tax Overview Committee is scheduled to meet quarterly.

VISION 2025 FINANCIAL

Sales tax collections for Vision 2025 are complete. In the months of July, August and September, approximately \$1,008,000 in project payments were processed for approximately \$648 million in project payments total to date.



PROJECT SUMMARIES:

ORIGINAL PROJECTS

River Projects:

36 Arkansas River Low Water Dams:

South Tulsa/Jenks - The 404 permit was issued by USACE in May 2020. Construction is funded by other sources.

Sand Springs: The Arkansas River Corridor Ecosystem Restoration Feasibility Investigation Draft Report, for the Sand Springs area was publicized in February 2017. The Feasibility Study Determination identifies a Federal Interest in a structured solution to the ecosystem restoration identified for this Sand Springs area. Vision 2025 funds are being utilized for the local share of the Preconstruction, Engineering & Design (PED), which began in 2020 with limited federal funding to perform the Cultural Resources study, which was completed late Fall 2021. USACE has received an appropriation of approximately \$1.39 million to continue design. A design charette was conducted in March 2024. USACE is in the process of contracting for additional geotechnical investigations.

38 Zink Lake – The project has been transferred to the City of Tulsa for implementation. Construction began in October 2020. Construction was completed in August 2024 in time for the public dedication and opening during the Labor Day holiday. The Zink Dam is fully operational, and Zink Dam, the whitewater flume and pedestrian bridge are open for use.

39 Route 66:

Cyrus Avery Centennial Plaza: This project is complete, July 2008 and the "East Meets West" bronze statue is complete, November 2013.

Meadow Gold Sign: This project is complete, May 2009.

Frisco Train Site: The Vision 2025 portion of this project is complete, July 2009.

11th and Yale Intersection: This project is complete, August 2013.

Interpretive Center: The City of Tulsa gathered stakeholder and public input for private development of the site following cancellation of the previous development proposal. Roadside Attraction and Commercial Development team have been awarded. Interactive Technology team will be selected in Q4.

Gateways: This project is complete, September 2015.

S.W. Boulevard Streetscape Improvements 33rd W. Ave. to 27th W. Ave. & Sue Bland Oil Well: This project is complete, April 2020.

11th Street (89th Ave to Garnett) Sidewalks and Landscaping: This project is complete, August 2012.



39 Route 66 continued:

Pearl Preservation: The original project is complete, November 2016. A Matching Façade Grant Program has launched. Grant recipients will commit to preserving historically significant structures along Route 66 and maintaining the restoration for a minimum of 6 years. **The first grant project is complete and there are currently no new applications.**

Howard Park: This project is complete, February 2017.

S.W. Boulevard Property Improvements (Frisco Train Site): This project is complete, April 2020.

Sue Bland Artwork: This project is complete, March 2016.

Informational Road Signs: This project is complete, December 2019.

Avery Park Southwest: This project is complete.

Traffic Circle Artwork (Route 66 Rising): This project is complete.

Kendall Whittier Pedestrian Lighting: This project is complete, March 2020.

NEW PROJECTS, AUTHORIZED BY THE TULSA COUNTY VISION AUTHORITY

I4 City of Jenks South James Sewer Improvements: This project consists of engineering / surveying, easement acquisition and construction of sewer and/or water infrastructure extending along South James Avenue. This extension will provide service to Tax Increment Financing District 4 on the west side of U.S. Highway 75. Engineering and design are complete, and the DEQ permit and easement have been acquired. Developer has put a hold on the project, the City is awaiting confirmation that the project will move forward before proceeding.

17 Broken Arrow Gateway Signage: The Gateway Signage project is included in a Master Plan approved in 2021. The preliminary design has been approved and the sign locations finalized. Construction Documents for four primary signs, two secondary signs, and eight tertiary signs are advertised for bid. Locations for four additional primary signs are being reviewed.

I8 Bixby 148th **St. Expansion:** This project extends 148th Street west from Memorial Drive through an industrial park, to connect to Bixby's TIF District No. 1. Property negotiations are underway, with construction scheduled to begin in November.



J1 County Roadway Improvements: Five County Roadway projects were approved to utilize Vision funds for design. Construction funds will be provided by other sources.

- 1) **121**st St., So. Elwood to Hwy 75 Engineering is approximately 59% complete; ROW acquisitions are being finalized.
- 2) **86th St. North** Design is 99% complete, utility relocations are underway, and water and electric utilities have been moved. All anticipated intersection right-of-way acquisition is complete. Roadway Right of Way acquisitions are in process.
- 3) 51st St. So. Widening between Lynn Ln & County Line Engineering is 99% complete and right-of-way acquisition is complete. Explorer Pipeline is coordinating utility relocations. New development at 51st Street warranted approval of an amendment for additional stormwater engineering. Proposed and relocated utilities are expected to be completed January 2025. TEC is designing pedestrian signals.
- 4) **Horsepen Creek Bridge Replacement** Engineering is complete. ODOT has completed the work with Vision Tulsa County Program funding, and the new bridge is in use. Project and payment complete.
- 5) 31st, 41st, 51st St. & County Line Intersections (Vision Tulsa Project) Engineering is 95% complete for all intersections, right-of-way acquisition for 51st roundabout is complete. Explorer Pipeline is coordinating utility relocations at 51st. New development at 51st Street warranted approval of an amendment for additional stormwater engineering. Proposed and relocated utilities are expected to be finished January 2025. TEC is designing pedestrian signals.

J7 Renovation LaFortune Park (3.2 Mile Perimeter) Trail: The project consists of complete renovation of the LaFortune Park Trail including replacement of the golf perimeter fence and new LED Trail Lighting. Construction began in Fall 2018 and the project was completed in November 2019. Remaining Vision funds assigned to the project will be utilized to improve access from the south Yale parking lot northward to the LaFortune trail. Earthwork, a sidewalk and boulder wall were complete as of September 2023. Entrance Lighting (poles) were added in September 2024.

K1 OSU Extension Office:

The office will be located at the OSU Tulsa campus. A long-term lease and Architect selection are in process.

K2 The Herd at LaFortune: The Herd is a joint project with the NatureWorks, LLC. The bison statues (with a goal of 40) will present a larger-than-life, hands-on experience for park visitors. The Herd is located adjacent to the LaFortune Park south picnic area. The County's commitment to provide the landscaping and foundation is complete. The first four statues have been installed and the facility opened in July 2023. Light poles were added in September, and the concrete bases are ready for the next group of statues, which has been delayed while the foundry corrects some imperfections.



K3 Chandler Miscellaneous Improvements: A heat pump and air handlers have been installed for the Splash Pad area, and chemical storage units have been purchased.

K8 Broken Arrow - Elm Pl & New Orleans St. Improvements: The project is to improve the Elm Place & New Orleans Street intersection. Improvements include pavement rehabilitation with on-street parking, signal modifications, sidewalk and ramp upgrades, as well as improved pedestrian circulation and streetscaping. Project construction is complete.

L1 N Boston Ave Pedestrian Bridge: Vision 2025 funds will be part of the inter-local funding of structural repairs to the North Boston Avenue Pedestrian Bridge over the BN&SF rail lines. Funds were issued to the City of Tulsa prior to advertising for bids in March 2024. The City has the Contractor in place, and permits are being obtained from the railroad.

ARKANSAS RIVER CORRIDOR PROJECTS PRELIMINARY DESIGN PROCESS:

The study area begins at Keystone Dam and ends downstream of the proposed Bixby Low Water Dam site. The Schematic Design, completed in April 2015, includes proposed low water dams at Sand Springs, South Tulsa/Jenks and Bixby, and major improvements to the existing Zink Dam. Other components of the Schematic Design included pedestrian bridges, public access areas, recreational facilities and amenities, infrastructure and outfall improvements, bank stabilization and environmental improvement project components. Cost estimates for construction and operation and maintenance were included as part of the Schematic Design Report. These report components were reviewed by the Technical Working Group, comprised of engineering representatives from each participating river city in Tulsa County, the Tulsa County Engineer, River Parks Authority, and representatives of the local construction industry. The final document is posted on and can be downloaded from the website www.riverprojectstulsa.info. The river projects approved in the Vision Tulsa proposition are consistent with the Schematic Design recommendations. Vision Tulsa funding will complete the design process and construct the proposed South Tulsa/Jenks Low Water Dam and improvements to Zink Dam. The final design of the Zink Dam improvements has been completed and bids for construction were received in May 2020. Contracting for construction has been completed and construction is complete. Zink Dam, Zink Lake and the whitewater flume are complete and opened to the public on Labor Day weekend, 2024. River Parks Authority is responsible for the operations, maintenance, and programming of Zink Dam, Lake and whitewater flume.

ARKANSAS RIVER CORRIDOR FEASIBILITY STUDY:

In order to continue the pursuit of federal funding authorized in WRDA 2007, Tulsa County and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) have successfully completed the Feasibility Study for the Arkansas River Corridor projects. The Feasibility Study was cost shared equally by Tulsa County (Vision 2025 funds) and the Federal Government (USACE). The final Feasibility Study Report was approved by USACE Headquarters. The Feasibility Study was completed under budget and on schedule. The approval of the Feasibility Study Final Report has allowed the Feasibility Study to transition into the Preconstruction Engineering and Design (PED) Phase. Federal funding has been requested for the PED process to continue into 2024. Local funding has been secured from remaining Vision 2025 funds for the required 35% local match. The PED phase agreement has been approved and signed by the BOCC and USACE. The PED kickoff meeting was held in late 2019. The Project Management Plan (PMP) has been approved and executed by Tulsa County and USACE. Environmentally related geotechnical studies have been completed for the proposed dam site in Sand Springs. The results of the HTRW geotechnical investigation indicated that there was no HTRW found at the proposed low water dam site in Sand Springs. USACE has received funding to perform the next study related to the Sand Springs Low Water

Dam site. A detailed Cultural Resources study has been performed and the report is complete. USACE has received a new appropriation of approximately \$1.39 million to continue the design effort on the Sand Springs LWD and related components. Encumbered Vision 2025 funds will be used to provide the local match for this detailed design phase. USACE is currently in the process of developing the scope and schedule for future design work. Preparation for beginning the design phase is underway. USACE has assigned a new Project Manager for the design process. A design charette was conducted in early March 2024. Several local Stakeholder meetings have been held to resume the design process. Additional geotechnical investigations are being planned for the near future to be used in the low water dam design. USACE is in the process of contracting for geotechnical services related to this project.

SOUTH TULSA/JENKS LOW WATER DAM 404 PERMIT:

The preparation of the 404 permit application for the South Tulsa/Jenks Low Water Dam was completed and the 404 permit application was submitted to the USACE. The processing of the 404 permit application was completed with the USACE issuing the 404 permit, SWT-2015-775, on June 1, 2020. The 404 permit has been approved and signed by USACE and Tulsa County BOCC. Vision funds for the City of Tulsa and City of Jenks will complete the design and construction of this LWD. Work on the South Tulsa/Jenks LWD has not begun at this time.

PMg OBSERVATIONS (including any project concerns): An Environmental Assessment (EA) was prepared for the Feasibility Study which supports the construction of the Sand Springs Water Control Structure (Low Water Dam). The 404 permit for the improvements to Zink Dam also required an EA to address potential environmental impacts. The USACE determined that an EA was required for the proposed South Tulsa/Jenks Low Water Dam. The project components identified in the Schematic Design document are evaluated in the required environmental document. The preparation of the Section 404 permit application for the South Tulsa/Jenks Low Water Dam has been completed, and the application has been submitted to the USACE. The 404 permit was approved and issued by USACE in May 2020. Work on the Arkansas River Corridor Feasibility Study by the USACE began in June 2015 and is complete. The Feasibility Report has been completed, reviewed, and approved by USACE Headquarters. The next phase is Pre-construction Engineering and Design (PED), and agency agreements have been developed and approved to begin the next phase. The initial work on PED has begun, and the local sponsor's share of PED funding has been secured. Initial geotechnical investigations to identify potential hazardous materials at the LWD site has been completed and no contamination was discovered. A new, detailed Cultural Resources study has been completed for the construction area to verify that no cultural resources impacts will occur in that construction area. This information is also being shared and used by other river-related projects in this area. USACE has received a new appropriation of approximately \$1.39 million to continue the design effort on the Sand Springs LWD and related components. Encumbered Vision 2025 funds will be used to provide the local match for this detailed design phase. USACE requested some of those Local Sponsor funds for the upcoming geotechnical contract and design efforts. Additional federal appropriations are expected in future federal budgets to complete the design phase.

The amendment for a 180-day extension has been executed by both parties. The agreement will end in mid-October 2017. The Route 66 Alliance is seeking a sponsor with a \$5M+ donation. The Route 66 Alliance is setting up meetings with American Airlines, Pixar and General Motors. The agreement expired, and the Route 66 Alliance notified. Efforts by the proposing team to complete final components of fund raising have been diligent. However, with the expiration of the exclusivity agreement and with final fund-raising benchmarks incomplete, The City will determine this spring the next step in accomplishing Tulsa's goal for the Route 66 Experience. Although the City has continued to consider funding additional resources and opportunities, the attention given to responding and managing the COVID-19 crises has been a shift in focus. A new RFP is being processed for a spring-summer 2021 release. The concept for a Rt 66 Interpretive Center with supporting amenities is similar to the original RFP. A public incentive of \$5M is included in the RFP; \$ 96,031.29 in Vision 2025 funds and \$4,903,968.71 in 2006 Sales Tax funds. 4th Quarter 2022: No report modification received from Sponsor.

1st Quarter 2023: RFPs are being evaluated by Rt 66 Commission. CIA is routing. No other changes 2nd Quarter 2023. 3rd Quarter 2023: The City of Tulsa will gather Stakeholder and public comments to provide input for the next solicitation of private proposals for the development site. 4th Quarter 2023: No changes December 2023.

1st Quarter 2024: Site constraints and delivery methods for an art installation are being evaluated.

2nd Quarter 2024: Property report, boundary survey, and geotechnical report completed and included in RFPs for site. 2 RFPs released (Roadside Attraction and Commercial Development). Roadside Attraction RFP proposals under review with 9-member selection committee -- selection to go to Arts Commission for recommendation in Q3. Commercial development RFP in circulation -- responses due 07.24.24. Interactive Technology RFP to be released Q3.

<u>3rd Quarter 2024:</u> Roadside Attraction awarded to Ken Kelleher; contract underway. Commercial Development team (Sharp Development) selected by panel; award to be made 10/3. 10 submissions received for Interactive Technology RFP – review panel to assemble and select a team in Q4.

Pearl Preservation:

Staff is working with Tulsa Preservation staff to develop proposed eligible projects, criteria for evaluating projects and allocation of the budget for various components. The Preservation Design Committee is discussing various ways to allocate small grants to businesses along the Route 66 Corridor for neon sign projects. 4th Quarter 2022: No report modification received from Sponsor. 1st Quarter 2023: Discussion underway with Rt 66 to use this for façade grants. 2nd Quarter 2023: No changes June 2023. 3rd Quarter 2023: The Façade Matching Grant policy is completed September 2023, and the program is scheduled to launch October 10, 2023. Master Plan line item "Pearl Preservation" funds will be encumbered in the future grants. 4th Quarter 2023: Has launched. No other changes, December 2023.

1st Quarter 2024: Contract 136892 executed 1-31-24 for Façade Matching Grant Program in the amount of \$34.806.89 (DW).

2nd Quarter 2024: Contract 136892 construction was ongoing and near completion. Final invoice for contract 136892 is expected in 3rd Quarter of 2024. There are currently no other Façade Matching Grant Program applications in process. (BB)

<u>3rd Quarter 2024:</u> Contract 136892 construction has completed. The contracting party submitted an acceptable invoice which was processed and sent to City of Tulsa Accounts Payable as well as PMG. There are currently no other Façade Matching Grant Program applications in process. (BB)

PMg OBSERVATIONS (including any project concerns):

Route 66 Xperience/Interpretive Center: The COT Project Team has assembled a "recommending panel" to develop a strategy for management, operations and private equity partnership for the Route 66 Interpretive Center. The purpose of the RFP being prepared by the Engineer/Planning Department is to allow the City to lease the property and have a partnership with an entity who has expertise to create, own and operate an interpretive center. The RFP will ask for a concept proposal and the City will have approval rights on all aspects of the facility, but not own or operate the center. City funds and Vision 2025 funds will be used to leverage the agreement. PMg requested a copy of the Memo of Understanding.

The contract benchmark for the Exclusivity Agreement was to raise \$2.5 Million on or before September 1, 2015. As of June 2016, the Alliance has received \$6.5 million in pledges of the \$16.5 Million contracted. The Alliance negotiations have potential donors who are willing to match if additional pledges are obtained. PMg has requested a copy of the new Exclusive Negotiations and Exclusive Option to Lease Agreement. The new agreement allows an additional 180 days to identify funding sources and secure commitments. The City of Tulsa's contribution to the project will be \$1,500,000 of Vision 2025 funds and \$5,000,000 of third-penny sales

tax funds for a total of \$6,500,000 in public funds. The agreement continues to require the \$16.5 million funds be committed by the Route 66 Alliance prior to the expiration date. The 180 additional days will expire February 1, 2017. 2nd Quarter 2019: No change. 3rd Quarter 2019: The City has not reported any change for this project since 2017. PMg requested an update from City staff. 4th Quarter 2019: The City has not reported any updates this quarter. 1st Quarter 2020: Pending update from City Spring 2020. 2nd Quarter 2020: No Change. 3rd Quarter 2020: No Change. 4th Quarter 2020: No Change. 2ND Quarter 2021: The new RFP may include restaurants or shops. Hotel or some residential use may be considered. Businesses considered will be those that will add a pedestrian flow after business hours. 2nd Quarter 2022: In May 2022, Sharp Development was selected for mixed use and interpretative center development. The next step is to negotiate a development agreement. The development team made a brief presentation of the concept to the Route 66 Commission. 3rd Quarter 2022: The City continues the process of reviewing and revising the pro forma and scheduling an infrastructure needs assessment meeting. 4th Quarter 2022: No change. 1st Quarter 2023: The City continues negotiating with Sharp Development for the Route 66 Experience Project. They are developing the scope of work and will have it available in a few months. PMg instructed that the Development Agreement be in accordance with the Master Plan and to be reimbursed, the work must be a capital item. The City indicated they had done some preparation at their own cost. PMg reminded them if the project doesn't happen, they will have to repay any funding from Vision 2025. Paul Zachary advised his staff to utilize Vision 2025 dollars first. 2nd Quarter 2023: The City is working with ODOT to receive ownership of right-of-way along 12th Street for the Mixed Use & Interpretive Center site. The City plans to use Vision 2025 funds for the survey expenses. No developer agreement is in place as the City is working through the pro forma that was revised since bringing a contractor on board. It is estimated the project will take up to three years to complete. 3rd Quarter 2023: No change. 4th Quarter 2023: The City of Tulsa hosted two public meetings in December to receive comments about the development at 815 S Riverside Drive. The guidelines for the project were: (1) funds for development of this location only (2) consider a relationship to the River (3) include a roadside attraction.

2nd Quarter 2022: The Avery Park SW project was completed in the 1st quarter of FY 2021, but the contractor's contract remains open due to a 3-year vegetative establishment period which began when the work was completed. This will also affect the Architect's contract. The final invoices will be submitted at the end of the 3-year period. The last contractor's invoice from August 2021 was submitted in June prior to the County's FY 2021/2022 annual audit. 3rd Quarter 2022: A balance of \$34,171.44 remains in open contracts. 4th Quarter 2022: No change. 1st Quarter 2023: The project cannot close due to a 3-year vegetative establishment period. PROJECT STATUS REPORT: The Project consists of complete renovation of the LaFortune Park Trail including replacement of the golf course perimeter fence. The trail is approximately 3.2 miles in length and is located along the perimeter of the park. The landscape architecture contract is funded with the original Vision 2025 funds in Subfund 26 in the amount of \$206,271.00. 4th Quarter 2021: The final cost of the Trail project was \$1,768,211.00.

LaFortune South Entry for ADA Access to the Trail

2nd Quarter 2022: At a meeting on May 2, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners approved the use of the remainder of the J7 Vision 2025 funds to provide an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) access from the south Yale parking lot northward to the LaFortune trail. The fund balance is currently \$89,057.84. These improvements will coincide with the completion of the Tulsa Herd project. Alaback Design was issued a Purchase Order amendment to their Herd contract for design. Tulsa County Parks Construction crew will self-perform most of the work. The demolition of the baseball cages and wall is complete. The crew will coordinate work in conjunction with their work on the Chandler Lower-Level restroom.

 $\underline{3^{rd}}$ Quarter: Sod was installed on a portion of the area to avoid erosion. No additional work is scheduled until the Chandler Park restroom is complete due to the labor shortage in the Construction crew. $\underline{4^{th}}$ Quarter: No report modifications this period.

1st Quarter 2023: Project remains on hold until the Chandler lower-level restroom is complete. The deadline for completion was not met. The Parks Department has not set another date at this time. 2nd Quarter 2023: With the reorganization of the Parks Department, the focus this quarter has been to determine how much of the work can be self-performed. Without the manpower available, PMg is preparing a request for quote for all the work except a small amount of remaining demolition and sod final grade with installation of sod. The scope will need to be re-written to include electrical scope and sidewalk installation.

<u>3rd Quarter 2023:</u> On July 26, 2023, a purchase order was awarded to Diversified Civil Contractors for the base bid. Phase I included sidewalk, earthwork and a boulder wall. The contractor's final job walk was held on Thursday, September 14, 2023. The Parks crew self-performed the laying of sod on September 19 and installation of landscape planting areas is scheduled for the week of October 2nd. Light fixtures and poles are on order and the installation will be part of the Phase II project. An application for funding for Phase II is in the works.

4th Quarter 2023: The light poles were received November 30, 2023, and the invoice is in process. Building Operations reviewed the drawings and agreed to install the lights with their construction crew. The installation date has not been determined as they will have to fit it into their already busy schedule. A balance of \$5,681.09 remains in the Vision 2025 fund to assist with the cost of installation.

PROJECT STATUS REPORT FROM SPONSOR:

<u>2nd Quarter 2022:</u> Construction continues of the project with work being approximately 80% complete. Remaining items to finish include cast in place concrete, fences and gates, metal railings, joint sealants and planting/landscaping.

The general Contractor Myers Cherry intends to be complete prior to the contractual completion date. Any potential change orders will result in reduced costs and will be quantified during the project close out.

Tulsa County Staff continues to coordinate the project with all parties to ensure an on-time and under budget completion.

PMg OBSERVATIONS (including any project concerns):

The Herd is a joint project with the Nature Works, LLC. Tulsa County has agreed to provide the location and infrastructure at LaFortune Park for the project. The proposed scope of work includes demolition, stone monuments, paving, sidewalks, stone edging, sandstone boulder wall, fencing, trees, new lighting, benches and possibly an irrigation system. Nature Works has agreed to provide and install the artwork pieces. The Bison will include bulls, heifers, yearlings and calves. The first to be installed will be the "First Family". The sculptor, Stephen C. LeBlanc is finishing the first four, bull, cow, yearling and calf. The minimum goal for the project is a herd of 40 animals. Donors are being sought for the remaining herd. This represents the third proposed Nature Works project being located at LaFortune, two that were promptly completed. The Herd will be located at the South picnic area near the batting cages. The bison statues will present a larger-than-life hands-on experience for park visitors. The architect has completed conceptual designs and is preparing the final design and bid documents. A meeting to approve these final documents will be held with Nature Works and Tulsa County Parks for final approval prior to advertising for bids. Tulsa County Highway Department has completed the demolition portion of the work.

4th Quarter 2020:

Commissioner Peters agreed to increase the Herd Project an additional \$83K. Since Alaback Design is pro bono and working for Nature Works, it was agreed to contract with Alaback to finish the design to fit the new project budget of \$330,000. Alaback will refine the plans to look for ways to cut costs and save money through design refinements. Engineering will negotiate with Nature Works to downsize the project stressing that the County will build what they can afford and if Nature Works wants to upscale finishes they will need to provide the funding. A contract with Alaback was

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approved December 14, 2020, excluding the Parking lot paving which includes demo, grading, paving and striping. Due to previous commitments, the Architect hasn't made much progress but expects to get started by mid-February.

<u>1st Quarter 2021:</u> Tulsa County Engineering is managing the project at the request of Commissioner Peters. The TCVA Application has not been submitted for approval for the additional funds.

<u>3rd Quarter 2021:</u> The Tulsa County Board of County Commissioners authorized the partial distribution of Vision Tulsa sales tax funds for the Herd Project on July 21, 2021, in the amount of \$80,000 in addition to the previously approved Vision 2025 funds of \$250,000. Tulsa County received updated construction documents from Alaback Design with an updated cost estimate in August. Tulsa County Procurement is scheduled to submit the documents for public bid the second week of November 2021.

4th Quarter 2021: Alaback's contract was inadvertently paid with Engineering funds. PMg worked with Tulsa County Finance and Engineering to remedy and make payment to reimburse Engineering for the invoice with Vision 2025 funds. A bid packet was issued November 8, 2021, and due on December 17, 2021, and opened December 20, 2021. A mandatory pre-bid conference was held November 30, 2021, at the LaFortune NE Shelter. The award recommendation will be on the BOCC agenda on January 10, 2022.

1st Quarter 2022: The notice to proceed was issued to Myers-Cherry on February 28, 2022, and mobilized March 1, 2022, to begin demolition. MCC encountered tree roots and Alaback revised the SW portion of the boulder wall to avoid damaging the trees. The project sign was approved, and the cost will be split between MCC and NatureWorks. NatureWorks will provide the donor sign and footing near the end of the project. In addition, the bison foundation design will be provided after NatureWorks takes possession of the "first family". A credit for this footing is \$500, a change order will be determined at the end of the project. Payment applications 1 & 2 were processed in March and April. Work for this quarter included 100% demolition, installing CMU block for stone columns, 100% completion of electrical work and 70% of earthwork.

<u>2nd Quarter 2022:</u> The monument sign is complete, and the bronze letters installed. Work this quarter includes forms for sidewalk, curb, and gutter, colored paving, stair steps and stone columns for the fence. Grading & Drainage plan is complete. The lights, to be installed by the Owner, have not been ordered. An adjacent project, South Entry ADA access to the trail, created an opportunity to change the sidewalk entrance from the parking lot to a more aesthetically pleasing and safe entrance. The contractor feels confident that they are on schedule to meet the original completion date of July 28, 2022.

<u>3rd Quarter 2022:</u> Myers Cherry contract was approved as substantially complete as of September 2, 2022. Final payment was made and the County's commitment to provide the landscaping and foundation is complete. The Parks construction crew will install lighting and benches as time permits. The first art installation by NatureWorks will be the "First Family", a bull, cow, yearling and calf. The bull and the yearling are being stored in Tulsa. The bronze foundry tells us the supply and labor issues throughout the industry have delayed the manufacturing of the cow and calf. It is

NatureWorks' intention to install the First Family at one time and has pushed the installation to mid-October in hopes the foundry can complete the sculptures. Donor opportunities and sponsorship information will be available through NatureWorks.org. as soon as the Foundry can provide up-todate pricing.

4th Quarter 2022: Heritage Concrete Construction will place the foundations for the "First Family" and seven benches funded by NatureWorks. The foundations are scheduled to be installed the week of December 26, 2022, and completed by January 10, 2023. The benches will be shipped after January 3, 2023. The first installation is TBD based on the delivery of the Cow/calf sculpture. The The cow/calf did not cast properly, creating a delay in delivery. The Foundry is closed until the first of 2023 and will update the delivery date at that time. NatureWorks, Heritage and a crane company will perform the work of setting and anchoring the sculptures. Tulsa County Parks will install the seven benches upon arrival.

1ST Quarter 2023: The installation of the bull and yearling was successful. The sculptures are wrapped as they will be unveiled after the cow/calf are installed and an unveiling is scheduled. NatureWorks has not had a response from the Foundry regarding the delivery of the cow/calf sculpture. NatureWorks will notify us when the Foundry notifies them of a firm delivery/installation date.

<u>2nd Quarter 2023:</u> The cow/calf sculpture was installed on Thursday, June 29th. This completes the first family of bison. NatureWorks is planning an unveiling event and will be working with the County Communications Manager, Karsten Villanueva, to schedule the event. NatureWorks commissioned another family, but no delivery schedule has been revealed. The minimum goal remains at a herd of 40 and will be commissioned as donations and sponsorships are forthcoming.

1ST Quarter 2021: This project includes construction of a sand volleyball facility at Chandler Park consisting of approximately three adjacent courts with sidewalks for separation, bleachers, water stations and other park appurtenances. The project is part of the Tulsa County Parks Master Plan with an allocated amount of \$200,000 from Proposition 4. 2nd Quarter 2021: PMg met with representatives from the Parks Department to discuss the location of the courts and determine when construction could begin with the constraints of other projects currently underway. PMg is also in the process of developing an itemized budget. 3nd Quarter 2021: PMg is still working with Parks Department to determine when construction could begin. 4th Quarter 2021: Work has yet to begin as the crew is wrapping up the Lower Level. However, weather permitting and coordinating with Highway and District 3 for equipment, the work is scheduled to start in March 2022. The Maintenance crew will provide the manpower.

- 1st Quarter 2022: Maintenance crews are currently unavailable for this project as they are finishing up other projects. 2nd Quarter 2022: The Maintenance crew continues their construction work at the Chandler Lower Level project. Until it is complete, the Volleyball project will be on hold. Change order 04 looks to be complete (which added a walking trail along New Orleans at the south side to connect to the trail completed by COBA. Asphalt mill and overlay is to start next month, and the full project is to be complete in May 2023. The City will submit a payment application towards the end of the project for reimbursement of the \$34,453.98 of Vision 2025 funding. PMg will continue to watch the work through completion.

<u>2nd Quarter 2023:</u> COBA has not submitted any recent pay applications or approved change orders as part of required Vision 2025. There was a change order extending the asphalt in all directions and this work is complete. The latest COBA quarterly report states that they are complete with the project minus punch list items.
